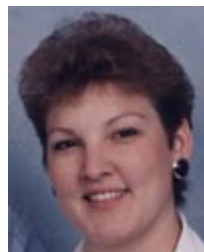

Melanoma Facts

- Every hour of every day, someone dies of melanoma in the US
- Melanoma strikes people of all ages, including children, of all races, and from all economic levels and both sexes
- In all persons ages 15–29, melanoma is the second most common cancer.
- Today, 1 in 60 people will develop melanoma. There will be 62,480 new cases of invasive melanoma this year and 8,420 people will die from melanoma.
- Since 1975 the incidence rate has more than doubled – 8.7 to 17.7
- For women 30-35 years – melanoma is the 2nd leading cause of death
- There have been no significant advances in medical treatment or survival of melanoma in the past 30 years
- Prompt action is your best protection. Common moles and melanomas don't look alike.
- The majority of melanoma is caused by exposure to UV light and sunlight.
- The best way to prevent skin cancer is to protect yourself from the sun:
